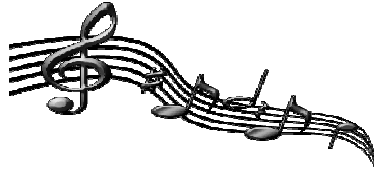

## Music Needs

### Handel's Messiah

Handel's Messiah is considered one of the great pieces of music. The Hallelujah Chorus is thought by many scholars to be the best known piece of music in the world (and that includes songs by the Beatles, Michael Jackson etc.). But The Messiah is something more than a famous piece of music or even a work of art. It is, first and foremost, a spiritual exercise of incredible beauty. Handel worked at a feverous pace over a period of three weeks inspired by an ecstatic vision as he put to music biblical passages telling the story of the birth, life, death and resurrection of the Messiah. The music works in collaboration with the words of scripture in telling the amazing story of Jesus Christ. Over five weeks we will look at Part 1 of The Messiah that deals with Christmas (the birth of Christ) and delve into the meaning of the scripture passages and Handel's musical treatment of them. This course starts on Tuesday, November 10, 2009 and runs to December 8, 2009 from 7:30 to 9:00 pm.
