Trillium's Puzzle Piece for the 100th Anniversary of the United Church of Canada



As part of the 100th Anniversary Celebration we were asked to prepare a Trillium puzzle piece for a giant puzzle representing churches in our Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council area.

Ideas for our puzzle were gathered and Maral Berejiklian and her mother, Silva Boghossian, volunteered to do the design using a collage technique. The result is a whimsical representation of initiatives that define Trillium United Church.

In case you are wondering about the black lines, our puzzle piece will be along one of the edges that will be attached to another Region-

al Council area's puzzle pieces. Below is an explanation about the different aspects of our puzzle piece:

Green Background - Trillium's colour.

Trillium Pin – Where Trillium gets its name.

The Cross Covered in Material and a Single Knot - Reflects the cross at the front of the sanctuary and the quilting and knotting groups' outreach, which is a tradition at Trillium.

Flowers and Bee and Butterfly - The pollinator garden is part of our environmental initiatives.

Children and Youth Sketched on Wood – Young people are seated around a campfire at Five Oaks on a work weekend.

Mobile Market Truck from the Food Bank – Arrives at the church every Tuesday as part of the Wellness Outreach programs.

Canada Flag and Welcome Sign – We support many newcomer families.

UCW Pin – Stands for the group of women who continue to enjoy life together and fundraise for the church and community.



Since November 2022, Trillium has hosted the Mobile Food Market, a program offered by the Cambridge Food Bank.

While retail grocery store prices continue to be high, having access to affordable fresh produce is important for many people in our community. By shopping at the Mobile Food Market, you can save 30-40% off retail pricing on a basket of fresh produce.

Baskets are \$10 each. If your basic needs are at risk, you may pay a minimum fee per basket, which is \$5.00, or more.

Everyone is welcome. You can support the program by paying more than the suggested price.

Special Easter Offering

It has been a tradition at Trillium to offer congregants the opportunity to donate to worthwhile projects as part of the Easter journey. Each year Social Concerns & Outreach team chooses two charities, one to help with the Life & Work of Trillium, and one for outreach in the community.

The Designations for 2025:

Life & Work of Trillium: The Good Samaritan Fund Outreach: Indwell Cambridge

Donations can be made (cash or cheque) using the special envelopes provided at the church or through an e-transfer. Please make sure to indicate clearly where the donation is to be directed.



If you are unfamiliar with The Good Samaritan Fund and Indwell Housing, SC&O team has provided the following information.

Trillium's Good Samaritan Fund Background Information

For many years Trillium congregants have responded to the call for donations to The Good Samaritan Fund when we become aware of the need for emergency support for a congregant or family in our church. Last year, for example, those who were able responded to the call for support for the Potts' family, after Pauline's sudden death. This fund is overseen by Rev. Mark, who makes decisions about the dispersal of this money when approached by someone in crisis.

At the present time SC&O team is concerned about the precarious situation in which some of our congregants may find themselves if tariffs result in loss of employment. We do not want people to lose their homes or to go hungry.

Indwell Affordable Housing Background Information

Indwell is a Hamilton-based Christian charity that has been supporting vulnerable adults dealing with mental health challenges for 50 years. They are the fastest growing developer of new supportive affordable housing in Ontario. Indwell communities support over 1,250 tenants in regions across Southern and Southwestern Ontario—with several projects currently under construction or pre-development. Indwell empowers tenants to achieve health and wellness goals, and to constructively engage with their communities.

Indwell is active in Cambridge. The 203-year-old building located at 1102 King St. E. in Preston was purchased by Indwell for an Affordable Housing Build, with a plan to expand the site into a 45-unit facility with spaces for tenants, offices for staff, and ground-floor commercial spaces intended to serve community needs, such as a pharmacy or library. The plan is to have this housing project finished and providing essential housing and community services by late 2026.

Indwell has raised \$1.7 million of the \$2.5 million needed for their share of the cost. On your behalf, SC&O donated to this project last year through the Trillium Distributions Fund, and would like to show Trillium's continued support through our Special Easter Offering this year.

Stuffed Peppers For One By Joan Zisk

Prep: 10 minutes Cook: 15 minutes Total: 25 minutes

Ingredients -

1 bell pepper (green, red, yellow, or orange)

1/4 cup chopped onions

5 ounces lean ground beef, or turkey or pork

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon coarsely ground black pepper

½ cup shredded cheddar cheese

½ tablespoon olive oil
1 clove garlic, minced
½ teaspoon Italian seasoning
1 small tomato, chopped
½ cup chopped fresh spinach



Preheat the oven to 375°F (190°C).

- Cut ½ inch off the stem end of the bell pepper to remove the top. Remove the seeds and membrane, rinse the inside, and slice the pepper in half lengthwise.
- Heat oil in a 10-inch skillet over medium-high heat. Add the onions and cook for 2 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add the garlic and cook for an additional 30 seconds, stirring occasionally.
- Add the ground meat, Italian seasoning, salt, and pepper to the skillet. Cook, breaking up the meat, until browned, about 3 minutes.
- Stir in the chopped tomatoes and spinach. Cook for 2 minutes, stirring frequently, until the spinach wilts.
- Remove the skillet from the heat and stir in all but 1 tablespoon of the cheese.
- Spoon the meat mixture into the prepared pepper halves. Place the filled peppers in a lightly greased 5×7 inch baking dish.
- Sprinkle the remaining cheese on top of the peppers. Cover the dish with aluminum foil and bake for 15 minutes.
- If the cheese hasn't fully melted, remove the foil and bake for an additional 5 minutes.
- Enjoy the stuffed peppers warm

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends,

When I was a child my parents took me to church so the seeds of a Christian faith were planted in me in those years. As a child Christmas was most definitely the biggest Christian festival of the year. I think that was mostly because I was personally invested in Christmas. I am talking about getting presents. It was also a time when we visited and shared meals with our extended family. Later, when I became an adult and returned to my Christian roots and started attending church I discovered that as important as Christmas was, it was Easter that was the big festival of the Christian faith. I still remember being astonished by this fact when it finally dawned on me. Easter was never a big deal in my family growing up. Beyond a few Easter eggs and a chocolate bunny there were no presents at Easter. We didn't travel very often to see our extended family either. Easter, at least as compared to Christmas, seemed pretty mundane to me as a kid.

Our Christian faith rises and falls on what happened on Easter morning. If everything else about Jesus could be shown to be legendary, like the virgin birth and angelic choruses, his teachings and his miracles but he really did rise tangibly from the dead then Christianity would still hold true on the critical feature that gave rise to. And if everything else about Jesus was proved to be true but he did not rise from the dead, then the whole edifice of the Christian religion would immediately collapse. We can live a full Christian life without Christmas but we cannot live a full Christian life without Easter. Easter is where it all comes down to.

There are five facts about the resurrection of Jesus that even most sceptical scholars agree with.

- 1. Jesus was crucified in Jerusalem by the Romans.
- 2. Jesus' disciples had experiences with one whom they believed to be the risen Christ.
- 3. The disciples proclaimed the reality of a risen Christ at a very early date.

- 4. Two major sceptics, James, the brother of Jesus and Saul of Taurus, came to believe that Jesus was the Christ based on what they thought were resurrection encounters with Jesus.
- 5. The disciples' lives were utterly transformed by the real experiences that they believed they had had with the risen Christ.

The sceptic New Testament scholar Bart Ehrman once wrote that it was the disciples' belief in the resurrection of Jesus that caused them to turn the world on its ear. Where did the disciples get this idea of the resurrection of Jesus from? These five facts above don't prove in themselves that Jesus was raised from the dead. That is probably beyond the power of any set of facts. Rather, in seeking to explain these five facts about the resurrection of Jesus and the transformation of Jesus' first disciples that changed the world it becomes very clear that the best explanation is that Jesus really was raised from the dead. No other explanation has what is called the "explanatory scope" or "power" to address all the facts related to the resurrection of Jesus.

It is important to remember that Trillium exists today because long ago, a core group of Jesus followers had experiences of the risen Jesus. These experiences of the Risen Christ fundamentally changed this core group of Jesus followers and it became their driving motivation to share this news that turned the world on its ears. That legacy has been passed on to us two thousand years later. Now it's our turn.
