

While retail grocery store prices continue to be high, having access to affordable fresh produce is important for many people in our community. By shopping at the Mobile Food Market, you can save 30-40% off retail pricing on a basket of fresh produce.

Baskets are \$10 each. If your basic needs are at risk, you may pay a minimum fee per basket, which is \$5.00, or more.


Everyone is welcome. You can support the program by paying more than the suggested price.





Pork Fried Rice for One

Prep Time: 10 Minutes Cook time; 15 Minutes Time; 25 Minutes

Ingredients:

1 tablespoon butter

1 (6 ounce) boneless pork loin chop, cut into small pieces

1 green onion, chopped

¼ cup chopped carrot

¼ cup chopped broccoli

1 large egg, beaten ½ cup cold cooked rice ¼ cup frozen peas

1 ½ tablespoons soy sauce

½ teaspoon garlic powder

¼ teaspoon ground ginger



Gather all ingredients.

Melt butter in a large non-stick skillet over medium heat. Add pork, green onion, carrot, and broccoli; cook and stir until pork is cooked through, 7 to 10 minutes.

Transfer pork mixture to a bowl and return skillet to medium heat. Stir egg into the skillet and scramble until completely set.

Add pork mixture back into the skillet; stir in rice, peas, soy sauce, garlic powder, and ground ginger. Cook and stir until heated through, 7 to 10 minutes. Serve and enjoy!

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends,

I stayed up too late last night watching the federal election returns. Now, Tuesday morning I am paying for it as I stare, blankly, at my computer screen. So often in life we play this zero-sum game. What goes up, must come down. For every winner there is a loser. For every smile there is a frown, for every laugh there is a tear.

I have never been a big fan of Jagmeet Singh, leader of the NDP. He lost his seat Monday evening. He came third in his riding which is quite a defeat. I found his concession speech Monday evening quite moving to listen to. He showed me a real grace and humanity in the way he talked to people about why he ran for office. I wonder why it is so hard for politicians to show this side of themselves in their engagement with the public. I think it would have stood him well to engage Canadians from this more vulnerable place.

Pierre Poilievre, leader of the Conservative Party, also lost his seat Monday evening. This was a surprise to many even though it had been reported in the press a few days earlier that his seat was in jeopardy. There will be much commentary on why Poilievre lost his seat and what the Conservatives should do going forward. My own feeling is that political parties today don't have the patience to allow leaders to grow into their role. Defeat and failure are often our best teacher in life but in the zero-sum game we live in, who has time for the learning that comes from defeat and failure?

I know personally the taste of defeat and failure in most aspects of my life. My happy marriage to Sally today rests on the failure of my first marriage to Monica. Without the kind of defeat that divorce brings I don't think I would have made the necessary changes in myself that has allowed me the blessings of a happy marriage. I see this same pattern in so many areas of my life. Defeat and failure lead to reflection, change and growth.

I think following Jesus Christ rests on the failure of our lives not working very well. Otherwise, why would

someone make the necessary 180 degree U-turn in life and follow the Lord? If your life is already working well for you, you don't need God and you don't need to make the big turn. It is only in our defeat and failure that we normally turn to God. It is in our constant and repeated defeat and failure that we keep turning more and more to the Lord.

Even the story of Jesus Christ rests on defeat and failure. Jesus came as the one who reveals God's face to people and to teach the world about holy love. And what happens to him? He ends up crucified. You can make the argument that this was always the plan. John the Baptist calls Jesus at the very beginning of the gospel the "lamb of God" who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29.) That means it was baked in from the beginning. But that only proves that our propensity to live our lives under our own management goes really deep. It is only when our self-management suffers an enormous defeat that we begin to yield ourselves to a higher authority.

I don't think anyone likes losing or suffering substantial defeat and failure in life. In fact, many of us attempt to avoid this possibility at all costs. We do need to remember that God doesn't play by the rules of the zero-sum game. God took the loss of the Cross and flipped it on its head. God took the failure of love that the Cross represents and made it into the ultimate symbol of love that comes about through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In fact, Jesus is the literal embodiment of a whole different set of rules by which God works by. That is what we are called to trust in our lives as we follow Christ. In our defeat a victory, in our death a resurrection.
