





Trillium Welcomed our newest family to celebrate Canada Day in style. The annual parade was another memorable event.



Wed. October 8 at 1195 King St East. Foot Care, Haircuts, and Massage


Friday, October 17 at Trillium. Foot Care only.

# Generosity

### **How Do You Decide What To Give?**

Being part of a church community like Trillium often leads us to reflect on many things, including how we choose to financially support the life and work of the church. There is no one "right" answer. For some, the amount to give is based on a percentage of their income. Others compare their giving to other areas of their life. Each approach says something about how they view generosity and what they value.

How does one decide the amount one gives to their church? There are so many factors to consider. Income, expenses and the priority of the church all play a significant part in our choice.

As the Generosity Team of Trillium, we are not asking "How much do you give?" Instead, we are really curious: How do you decide how much to give? What guides your thinking? What values and priorities shaped that choice?

Some people, for instance, choose to give a specific percentage of their income. Donating a percentage of one's yearly income to Trillium wouldn't fully answer the question however. Imagine someone who donates 2% of their yearly income to Trillium.

The question could still be asked, why 2%? Why not less? Why not more?

Some people choose to donate the equivalent amount to Trillium that they spend on their yearly travel. Others choose to donate the same amount that they spend on their yearly gym membership. One could imagine many other similar scenarios.

We know that everyone's circumstances and connections to Trillium are unique. That's why we are not suggesting a particular number or formula. But we do encourage you to bring intention to the process. To choose an approach that feels meaningful and grounded in your values.

Having a clear reason behind your giving, whatever the amount, can be a powerful expression of your relationship with the church and your vision for its future. When more of us give with this kind of clarity and purpose, it strengthens the whole community.

Having this degree of intentionality in the church would move Trillium forward in leaps and bounds as a Faith in Bloom community.

Since November 2022, Trillium has hosted the Mobile Food Market, a program offered by the Cambridge Food Bank.

While retail grocery store prices continue to be high, having access to affordable fresh produce is important for many people in our community. By shopping at the Mobile Food Market, you can save 30-40% off retail pricing on a basket of fresh produce.

Baskets are \$10 each. If your basic needs are at risk, you may pay a minimum fee per basket, which is \$5.00, or more.

Everyone is welcome. You can support the program by paying more than the suggested price.

The market runs every Tuesday from 5 to 6pm. Volunteers are essential to the program and several Trillium members have willingly given their time. If you wish to volunteer to help at the Mobile Food Market, please contact Wanda Brain.

Rollerskating was a new experience for many of the children and young adults from Trillium and everyone had a great time!








## Alpha@Trillium

# Parish Nurse @ Trillium

Trillium's Health and Wellness ministry has had a success with their summer programs. Monday's Community Support Connections **Balance and Strength exercise program** was very well received and has had 12–20 participants each week. This program finishes on 6 October and we are in the planning stages of offering an alternative CSC exercise program at 1pm starting 13 October. This will be confirmed at a later date.

In July a new support group met for the first time. This group is for parents who have challenging relationships with their adult children. Group participants are from Trillium and from the community. **Trillium's Parent Support Group** (TPSG) will continue meeting on a monthly basis one Wednesday per month from 12 noon – 1pm. Please contact Sally if you are interested in more information about joining this group.

The 4-week **Harvest Table** allowed congregants to share their extra garden produce with others, during Coffeetime.

The HWT fall programming is well under way. We are hoping to offer a 4-6 week **meditation group** led by our own Lynda Flagler. More information to follow.

In September, a small group of volunteers will begin offering a twice/month social group at 1195 King Street East, know as **Satellite Social Drop-In**. In a survey conducted by HWT earlier this year, tenants identified this as a wish for their community. This group will meet for a social time of shared company and playing card games. There will be a trial period from September to November 2025 before a decision will be made to continue this outreach program.

Thank you to all the volunteers and HWT members who make it possible for our ministry to serve Trillium and the community around the church.

## **Pastor Mark's Musings**

Dear Friends,

I am writing this musing on August 26. Tomorrow, Sally and I are heading to the UK for a family wedding. We booked our tickets months ago with Air Canada. Now we are keeping our fingers crossed. It looks like everything is a go but with the recent strike action everything feels a little bit more fragile. I was reading today at several news sites that there is a good chance that Air Canada's flight attendants will reject the tentative agreement. If that happens things should go to binding arbitration but who knows for sure.

Sally and I feel a bit frustrated about this because we did everything right. We booked our flights well in advance of the travel dates. We arranged our visit to maximize time spent with our overseas family. We've managed the finances of the trip in a responsible manner. We organized our time away from Trillium so that it will hopefully have minimal impact on you. And yet, here we are facing real uncertainty in the midst of our careful planning with circumstances we could not have foreseen.

I was reading lately that Artificial Intelligence (AI) is coming on stream very quickly and it could have a dramatic impact on white collar work going forward. Jobs that seemed secure only a few years ago could easily disappear in the next decade or two. People who are being directly touched by AI might be feeling very frustrated by the changing realities they face. In many cases they took great care in their career selection, worked hard to gain the proper education for this career and have committed themselves to a high-level workplace performance. They did everything right and yet in the midst of their careful planning they could be dealing with an uncertainty they could not have foreseen.

There is a great series on YouTube about major successful corporations that later filed for bankruptcy and then disappeared. Companies like Toys R Us, Party City, Quizno's, Pizza Hut and others you probably haven't heard of. These were companies that had a great initial concept, a time of huge success but then encountered unforeseen circumstances and ultimately proved incapable in adapting to the new realities they faced. In many cases, their failure wasn't

really their fault. It is just that they got swept up in the tidal forces of the times and couldn't find a way of making it through.

I think it is fair to say that life is always about contending with unforeseen circumstances. It could be a family health emergency, a mechanical failure that leaves you stranded on the side of the highway, a Friday afternoon meeting with your supervisor, lost keys, a misplaced phone or even a knock on your front door. The uncertainty that lurks around the corner in life for us is always there. What to do?

Paul asks this same question in Romans 8:35, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?" His answer is the following.

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:37-38

Paul reminds us that there is at least one certainty in life. It is God's love for us. In the midst of the unforeseen circumstances of life Paul encourages us to draw even closer to God's love for us. It is the only reality that truly endures. It is the only reality in life that we can truly rest ourselves upon. The love of God for us is the only true place where we find peace.
