Health and Wellness

Health and Wellness Team

The Team has a focus on outreach by organizing regular clinics offering personal care: foot care, haircuts and massage. Most people accessing clinics are from the community. All clinics are managed by volunteers and attended by Trillium's Parish Nurse.

Personal Care Clinics - Pay-as-you-can

In October, the team organized two clinics: October 8th at 1195 King Street apartments and October 17 at Trillium. The October 8th clinic offered foot care, massage and haircuts. On October 17, only Foot Care was offered to address an ongoing waiting list for this service. Our Parish Nurse was on hand at both clinics to offer Wellness Checks. A feature of these clinics is an opportunity for socializing over refreshments.

Beyond a 2025 grant from the Up Fund (Western Ontario Waterways Region), the team appreciates the support this year from fundraising groups—Garage Sale, UCW, and Beef Supper—as well as private donations. Individuals can donate to this program by designating to "Community Wellness." Many thanks to volunteers at the October clinics – Liz Reed, Carol Fleet, Janice Cruickshank, Joanne Sarkisian, Jim Potts, Liz Reed, Ana D'Sa, and Ruth Thompson

Massage Clinics - FREE

On October 31, the team hosted the second Massage Clinic featuring third year Conestoga College Massage Therapy students.

Four students offered free massages to benefit twenty people including eleven from Trillium. Participants had the option for service on a massage bed or a massage chair. Feedback from participants was positive. Sally White, Parish Nurse, was on hand to offer Wellness Checks. As with all clinics, refreshments were available.

Baskets are \$10 each. If your basic needs are at risk, you may pay a minimum fee per basket, which is \$5.00 or more.










Adult Spiritual Growth

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends,

Generally, I don't like the idea of surrender. I like stories where people battle to the end and go down with the ship. Someone battles against cancer, against injustice or against an oppressive enemy and refuses to surrender even at the risk of total defeat. I love those stories. Think about Winston Churchill's famous speech after the Allied defeat at Dunkirk in June, 1940. Basically, Britain lost everything at Dunkirk and immediately afterwards it had very few armed troops to resist a German invasion (in fact, the only fully organized division in those early days was a recently arrived Canadian Division.) Yet at that moment Churchill uttered these famous words to the British House of Commons.

Even though large tracts of Europe and many old and famous States have fallen or may fall into the grip of the Gestapo and all the odious apparatus of Nazi rule, we shall not flag or fail. We shall go on to the end. We shall fight in France, we shall fight on the seas and oceans, we shall fight with growing confidence and growing strength in the air, we shall defend our island, whatever the cost may be. We shall fight on the beaches, we shall fight on the landing grounds, we shall fight in the fields and in the streets, we shall fight in the hills; we shall never surrender.

We shall never surrender! I love it. Amen.

I like sports teams that never give up, never stop trying to win, and no matter what the odds are they won't surrender. I love to hear stories about people surviving and overcoming against the odds. The indomitable spirit rising to the occasion. Magnificent!

One song we sing in our worship services at Trillium that I particularly like is Make Room. It is a simple song with only one verse and the verse goes like this.

Here is where I lay it down Every burden every crown

This is my surrender
This is my surrender
Here is where I lay it down
Every lie and every doubt
This is my surrender

There is that difficult word again, "surrender." I have to admit to you that these lyrics touch me deeply and at some place in me, beyond words, it connects with my spirit. I want to surrender myself to God. I also have to admit to you that in practice I don't surrender myself to God in the way that I want to. In fact, there is a part of me that cries out in defiance against God, "I shall never surrender." This gets me thinking about what kind of surrender I am being invited into with my walk with Jesus.

As I think about the question of surrendering it seems to me that God is not asking for an unconditional surrender from us. It might seem like that at times but that is not what it means to follow Jesus Christ. What God is seeking from us is a very specific and special kind of surrender. God wants us to relinquish the God position in our lives back to Him. God is calling us to give up our total claim to ourselves and move back into a collaborative relationship with Him. God is asking us to surrender trying to do life on our own terms apart from Him.

Remember, the Bible tells us not to surrender to the world. In fact we are to put on the full armour of God as we struggle to resist the dark and evil forces at work in the world. But we can only do this when we are fully collaborating with the Lord. That requires a special kind of surrender that is unique to our relationship with God. It is only when our collaboration with our Heavenly Father is strong that the full might and power of heaven can become real to us and in us. That is the true source of our victory.
