NEWS FROM THE STONE CHURCH


The Stone Church Bookstore had a successful sale Nov. 29. The numbers need to be confirmed but I'm confident that proceeds from the day will put us over \$3,000 for the year. Thanks to Betty-Anne Madill and Laurie Schmidt for staffing the bookstore for the sale.

This year will be the second highest for sales since the store opened four years ago, well ahead of what was our second-best year. With any kind of luck, our four-year total could hit \$11,000 by the end of the year.

Please do visit us and buy a book or two before the year is out. It would be great to hit our target.

We plan to close the bookstore on Sundays during January and February next year when business is typically down. We will continue to stay open on Wednesdays from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. as long as we continue to have visitors on that day. We are planning one-day sales in January, February and March and there is a possibility of keeping the store open one Sunday in each of the three months. More on that later.

Climate Justice Vigil

An intrepid group of environmentalists gathered on November 16, in front of St. Peter's Lutheran Church. Despite the chilly weather, the group enjoyed an informative message from Mike Morrice, Green Party representative for the Kitchener riding (2019-2025) and the first Green Party member of parliament elected in Ontario.

The vigil was focused on the COP Climate Conference which was taking place in Brazil at that time and also included meditations and prayers for climate justice. The event was a collaboration between St. Peter's Church and Trillium. It was brought about by Pastor Laura Sauder at St. Peter's reaching out to Sifa who had made contact with her during the summer. Developing environmental connections between local churches was one of the aims of Sifa's work as a United Church Climate Motivator. The event was organized by Pastor Laura, Sifa and Liz Reed, leader of Trillium's Green Team.

A big thank you goes out to all who attended the vigil as we work together to live out our Core Value to "Care for the earth and all creation".

Health and Wellness

Health and Wellness Team

The Team's outreach focus involves regular clinics offering personal care: foot care, haircuts and massage. Most people accessing clinics are from the community. All clinics are managed by volunteers and attended by Trillium's Parish Nurse.

Personal Care Clinics - Pay-as-you-can

In November, the team organized one clinic at Trillium on November 5 offering Foot Care and Haircuts. Our Parish Nurse was on hand to offer Wellness Checks. A feature of these clinics are opportunities for socializing over refreshments.

The clinics are possible with funding from the Up Fund (Western Ontario Waterways Region), and Trillium fundraising groups—Garage Sale, UCW, Pie Bakers, and Beef Supper—as well as private donations. Individuals can direct donations to this program by designating to "Community Wellness."

Massage Clinics - FREE

On November 21, the team hosted the third Massage Clinic featuring third year Conestoga College Massage Therapy students.

Five students offered free massages to benefit twenty people including six Trillium members. Feedback was once again positive. Sally White, Parish Nurse, was on hand to offer Wellness Checks. As with all clinics, refreshments were available.

Since November 2022, Trillium has hosted the Mobile Food Market, a program offered by the Cambridge Food Bank.

While retail grocery store prices continue to be high, having access to affordable fresh produce is important for many people in our community. By shopping at the Mobile Food Market, you can save 30-40% off retail pricing on a basket of fresh produce.

Baskets are \$10 each. If your basic needs are at risk, you may pay a minimum fee per basket, which is \$5.00 or more.

Everyone is welcome. You can support the program by paying more than the suggested price.

The market runs every Tuesday from 5 to 6pm. Volunteers are essential to the program and several Trillium members have willingly given their time. If you wish to volunteer to help at the Mobile Food Market, please contact Wanda Brain.


The current Alpha course concludes on December 9 with a celebration potluck dinner.

Parish Nurse @ Trillium

As we approach the Christmas season and the end of 2025, my mind turns to reflecting on what has been achieved during the past year by the parish nurse ministry and its service to Trillium and the community.

I am reminded of the truly unique role that this ministry plays not only within the Trillium family but outside Trillium in the community which we serve. This ministry and Community Wellness program do not reach out into the community by accident. You, the congregation here at Trillium, made a conscious decision to have the role of the parish nurse in our church, including connecting with people who are not part of our congregation. The main way the parish nurse connects with the community at large is through the Community Wellness-run Personal Care Clinics. At these clinics, wellness checks are offered. These include blood pressure checks if desired. This is an opportunity for the parish nurse to engage with people who have come to the clinic for foot care or a haircut or a massage appointment. In many cases this is how the relationship between a community member, who might not be connected to Trillium in any way, connects with and becomes a recipient of care offered by this unique ministry.

In 2023 reports show that sixty parish nurses were practicing in Canada. Yes, sixty! In the whole of Canada!

Not only is Trillium offering a ministry that is not common in faith communities in Canada as a whole, but it is unique in that this Trillium ministry is mandated to reach out into our community.

This is a perfect demonstration of living out our Core Values in everyday life: showing the love of Christ to our community. We model our actions on the core values of:

Reach out and serve others with kindness Offer friendship and fellowship to all

The parish nurse and the Community Wellness ministry would not have the reach that they have without the dedicated volunteers that staff our clinics and support this ministry. Our thanks to you all! You certainly are God's love in action and God's hands in the world!

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends,

Do you remember as a child the wonder and beauty of Christmas? I certainly do. It was such an exciting time. It was more than the excitement of opening presents on Christmas morning. The whole build up to Christmas Day was so wonderful. The Christmas carols on the radio and the decorations in people's homes were inspiring. The growing darkness of December and the outside lights on the front of people's homes had a mysterious, almost mystical feel for me. I loved the many animated Christmas specials and the strong sense of family at this time. I understood in a very vague sense the religious dimension to the season. Christmas was the time to celebrate the birth of the Son of God into our world.

Sadly, today, I don't feel the same way about the Christmas season as I once did as a kid. Part of this is because I am pastor and the Christmas season means a lot more work for me. A larger part of this is because I grew up and I lost contact with that more poetic side of me. Very few things today really capture me in the way they used to when I was a child. I really miss that connection to things. Is there a way for me to get it back? Don't think I haven't tried. For many years I've made it a practice to watch the various animated Christmas specials so as to maintain the link with my childlike enthusiasm for Christmas. I put up Christmas lights every year on our eaves trough. I try to listen to Christmas music. When my daughter Elizabeth was little I tried to live Christmas vicariously through her. All these helped a little but they didn't really get me back to where I had been as a child.

The biologist Charles Darwin noted a decline in his intellectual and emotional capabilities as he grew older. He could feel his link with people and things weakening as he aged. He especially lamented his growing loss of interest and appreciation for art and music in his later years. Darwin said that if he had a second chance to live life he would make it a rule to consistently read poetry and listen to music as he got older. He felt

that this would have preserved his happiness and potentially his intellect and moral character.

I think maintaining a link with our poetic nature is a critical feature of following Jesus. Jesus didn't use those exact words. Rather he said, "'Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." In Jesus' time the goal of adult life was mastery. Mastery of our skills and the goals that they serve. Darwin talked about this mastery in terms of his mind becoming "a kind of machine for grinding general laws out of large collections of facts". To become a child again is a demotion of sorts because it moves us away from the world of mastery and back to a time of dependency and wonder. Yet interestingly, it turns out becoming childlike is the way we preserve our happiness, intellect and moral character. Go figure! We have a wonderful opportunity this Christmas season to embrace our return to being a child again. We do this in our rendezvous with Jesus in Bethlehem. Come. let us adore him. Come. let us adore him. O Come, let us adore him. Christ the King!
